Legislative Initiatives

- **Bill:** [25-1053](#)-August 4, City Council referred the Vibrant Denver bond package to the November 4, 2025 ballot. Voters will consider five separate questions regarding transportation and mobility, parks and recreation, health and human services, city facilities, and housing and shelter infrastructure
- **Bills:** [25-0684](#) & [25-0685](#)-August 4, City Council unanimously approved zoning code amendments that remove minimum parking requirements citywide.
- **Proclamation:** [25-1124](#)-August 4, Councilwoman Sandoval sponsored a proclamation recognizing the Annual Brothers Redevelopment and Denver Employee Volunteer Opportunities Paint-A-Thon Day which provides free critical home maintenance support to fixed-income older adults in Denver.



Legislative Initiatives cont.

- **Bill: [25-0922](#)**- August 11, City Council voted against referring the updated Xcel Energy Franchise Agreement to the November 4, 2025 ballot. The franchise agreement sought voter approval to grant the utility access to the public right-of-way in Denver to install, repair, and maintain facilities through 2046.
- **Bill: [25-0920](#)**- August 11, City Council referred a Charter amendment to the November 4, 2025 ballot which, if passed, would change the way the City Council at-large seats are elected by placing the two seats on separate ballots.
- **Bill: [25-1014](#)**- August 11, City Council voted against referring a Charter amendment to the November 4, 2025 ballot that proposed changing to instant runoff elections with ranked choice voting.



Legislative Initiatives cont.

- **Proclamation: [25-1205](#)**- August 18, Councilmembers Sandoval, Gonzales-Gutierrez, Parady, and Kashmann co-sponsored a proclamation recognizing SMART Week, which raises awareness and promotes efforts to educate the public secure gun storage.
- **Proclamation [25-1243](#)**- August 25, Councilwoman Sandoval sponsored a proclamation celebrating 40 years of KUVO 89.3 FM broadcasts and Canción Mexicana.

in Denver

-  **CALL OR TEXT 911 FOR EMERGENCIES**
Call if you can, text if you can't.
-  **CALL 720.913.2000**
Call the non-emergency line to report crimes that are not in-progress, such as property crimes where the suspect is no longer on scene.
-  **VISIT OUR WEBSITE**
Some non-emergency police reports can be filed online -- visit [denvergov.org/police](#) and click "report crime now."
-  **WALK-IN TO A STATION**
File a police report in person by walking in to any one of our six district stations.
-  **SUBMIT TIPS ANONYMOUSLY**
